PRESENTER

Dr. Popuri Krishna completed medical school in 1980 at Kurnool Medical College, India. He completed his Diploma of Psychological Medicine (DPM) in Osmania University in 1984 and his residency training at the University of New York in 1998. Dr. Krishna attended the fellowship training in geriatric psychiatry at the University of Maryland and Virginia Hospital in Baltimore in 1999. After obtaining his Diplomate American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology designation (DABPN) in 1999, he worked as a psychiatrist in Coffeyville, Kansas, in general and geriatric psychiatry. Dr. Krishna has been working as a consultant psychiatrist in Sudbury since December 2002. He obtained his Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of Canada (FRCPC) in 2005. Apart from inpatient and outpatient psychiatry services, Dr. Krishna provides services to the Counseling and Treatment Program, Assertive Community Treatment Team, and in-hospital geriatric consultation services in Sudbury. His current interests are in rehabilitation psychiatry, mood disorders, and geriatric psychiatry.
