**Dr. Carney Matheson** is a Professor and the Chair of Anthropology at Lakehead University. Dr. Matheson's current research includes molecular archaeology, molecular paleopathology, and forensic science. His research includes study of recovered bodies such as WW1 soldiers, first century tombs in Jerusalem, the Red Queen of Palenque Mexico, and the remains and tools of Ötzi the Iceman.
