PRESENTER

Dr. David Marsh graduated in Medicine from Memorial University of Newfoundland in 1992, following prior training in neuroscience and pharmacology. In July 2010, Dr. Marsh joined NOSM as Associate Dean, Community Engagement. Author of over 40 peer-reviewed papers, book chapters and government reports, Dr. Marsh's research interests focus on withdrawal management, methadone maintenance, heroin-assisted treatment, and harm reduction interventions such as supervised injection.

Dr. E. Drucker Ernest Drucker is Professor Emeritus in the Department of Family and Social Medicine, Montefiore Medical Center/Albert Einstein College of Medicine; and Senior Research Associate and Scholar in Residence at John Jay College of Criminal Justice of The City University of NY. He is licensed as a Clinical Psychologist in NY State and conducts research in AIDS, drug policy, and prisons and is active in public health and human rights efforts in the US and abroad. His book, *A Plague of Prisons: The Epidemiology of Mass Incarceration in America*, was published by The New Press in Sept of 2011.
