

# TIPS & TOOLS FOR INTERACTIVITY



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TIP SHEET

An interactive presentation is one in which the audience, regardless of size, can take part and voice their opinions by responding to questions, posing their own, or interacting with the presenter. Below you will find resources and best practices to promote audience engagement and enhance interactivity in seminars.

## Engage the Crowd



Use Humour

Show your personality and sense of humour to build rapport with the crowd. Humour can help your audience retain your key points.



Eye Contact

Good eye contact gives you a strong stage presence and can help you deliver your point effectively. Try to connect with each section of the audience.



Body Language

Gestures and body posture help connect to your audience. Gesturing, a confident posture, and moving around command the audience's attention.



Effective Language

Use inspiring language and adjust your tone of voice to impact and influence the audience. Adjust your language depending on whether the context is formal or informal, depending on your audience's level knowledge of the material, etc.



Make it Personal

Storytelling & sharing personal experiences capture the audience's attention, make your presentation memorable, and keep people entertained.

## Break the Ice

The perfect starting point is to ask a straightforward question to warm the audience. This is a simple way to turn your audience from listeners to active participants.

Plan your presentation and slide deck to be clean, simple to follow, and not too complex. Keep all essential details and allow the audience to ask about specifics during a Q&A session. 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## Tools for Interactivity

Use tools to encourage your audience to take part and join in. This is also valuable for the presenter as you can gain helpful insights and data about the audience, their presentation experience, and any takeaways.

	In Person	Virtual
<b>Polls</b>	Boost engagement and motivation while reinforcing key points. Invite participants to join an online quiz or poll using a platform like Slido (provide a QR code or URL). Share your screen to show results.	
<b>Quizzes</b>		
<b>Q&amp;A</b>	Encourage participants to ask questions or pose a question to the group.	Use the chat box feature when presenting virtually.
<b>Word Clouds</b>	Get a sense of your audience's experience and perspectives by inviting them to add to an online Word Cloud (provide a QR code or URL to join). Share your screen to show results.	
<b>Small Group Work</b>	Divide your large group into small groups or pairs. Pose a question for the small group to discuss, then ask them to share their findings.	Use break out rooms in virtual meetings to create a similar dynamic.
<b>Whiteboards</b>	Use a physical whiteboard, provide sticky notes, or provide a pad of paper on each table to encourage collaborative brainstorming.	Invite participants to join a virtual Whiteboard (provide a QR code or URL). Share your screen to show results.

## Webex Screen Share

To share your screen:

1. click "Share" in the bottom toolbar.
2. click "Share Screen" or "Share Application."

To Stop sharing your screen:

1. click the "Stop Sharing" button in the floating bar at the top of the screen.

There are a number of online platforms that you can use to boost interactivity in virtual or in-person presentations. Most of these platforms allow your audience to join and participate by scanning a QR code or visiting a URL on their devices.
